## **Level I Fieldwork (A) Learning Objectives**

At the completion of this course, the successful occupational therapy (OT) student will be able to:

- 1. Apply knowledge of HIPAA guidelines, the AOTA code of ethics, and the Standards of Practice in OT in the context of the Fieldwork site.
- 2. Demonstrate sound judgement regarding safety of self and others and adhere to Fieldwork site safety regulations.
- 3. Demonstrate appropriate professional behaviors: time management, organization, self-directed learning, communication, and use of professional terminology.
- 4. Describe the values and beliefs of OT.
- 5. Define the role of OT in relation to the Fieldwork setting.
- 6. Identify and provide evidence that can inform clinical practice at the Fieldwork site.
- 7. Articulate the purpose of interprofessional collaboration in healthcare and interpret how those concepts are implemented at the Fieldwork site or could be implemented if it is not already established.
- 8. Identify psychosocial factors for the client and/or population at the Fieldwork site and describe how those factors can influence occupational performance.
- 9. Describe how social determinants of health influence the client and/or population at the Fieldwork site and identify actions that OTs can take ensure these factors are being considered during the therapeutic process.
