

## **Level I Fieldwork (B) Learning Objectives**

At the completion of this course, the successful occupational therapy (OT) student will be able to:

1. Apply knowledge of HIPAA guidelines, the AOTA code of ethics, and the Standards of Practice in OT in the context of the Fieldwork site.
2. Demonstrate sound judgement regarding safety of self and others and adhere to Fieldwork site safety regulations.
3. Demonstrate appropriate professional behaviors: time management, organization, self-directed learning, communication, and use of professional terminology.
4. Examine how personality traits could be benefits or barriers to employing therapeutic use of self with clients.
5. Explain the role of OT in addressing psychological and social factors of clients and/or populations in the context of the Fieldwork site.
6. Analyze the services provided from all professions at the Fieldwork site/practice setting and compare and contrast the role of OT to/with those of other health care professionals in the context of the Fieldwork site.
7. Examine the psychosocial factors for a client at the Fieldwork site and explain how those factors influence participation in the therapeutic process.
8. Design and implement intervention strategies to remediate and/or compensate for functional cognitive deficits, visual deficits, and psychosocial and behavioral health deficits that affect occupational performance. (ACOTE B.4.9)
