## Level I Fieldwork (B) Learning Objectives

At the completion of this course, the successful occupational therapy (OT) student will be able to:

- 1. Apply knowledge of HIPAA guidelines, the AOTA code of ethics, and the Standards of Practice in OT in the context of the Fieldwork site.
- 2. Demonstrate sound judgement regarding safety of self and others and adhere to Fieldwork site safety regulations.
- 3. Demonstrate appropriate professional behaviors: time management, organization, self-directed learning, communication, and use of professional terminology.
- 4. Examine how personality traits could be benefits or barriers to employing therapeutic use of self with clients.
- 5. Explain the role of OT in addressing psychological and social factors of clients and/or populations in the context of the Fieldwork site.
- 6. Analyze the services provided from all professions at the Fieldwork site/practice setting and compare and contrast the role of OT to/with those of other health care professionals in the context of the Fieldwork site.
- 7. Examine the psychosocial factors for a client at the Fieldwork site and explain how those factors influence participation in the therapeutic process.
- 8. Design and implement intervention strategies to remediate and/or compensate for functional cognitive deficits, visual deficits, and psychosocial and behavioral health deficits that affect occupational performance. (ACOTE B.4.9)
